This message is being sent to all international faculty and staff at the University.

We understand that recent changes in immigration policies, including the possibility of a travel ban affecting specific nations, can create uncertainty. These developments may affect members of our community in different ways, and we want to assure you that the University is committed to supporting you during this time with resources and guidance.

To assist you, the University is offering the following support:

Informational Sessions

In partnership with Green and Spiegel, an immigration law firm, we will host virtual informational sessions to provide updates on immigration policy changes and potential travel restrictions.
